Message from the President and Executive Director

During the past year, the work of CFSH has been wide-ranging. Both in the forefront and behind the scenes, the Canadian Federation for Sexual Health (CFSH) successfully gained recognition both internationally and nationally as a leading expert in sexual and reproductive health.

Internationally, CFSH presented at the International AIDS Conference in Toronto, as a founding member of the *Blueprint for Action on HIV/AIDS for Women and Girls*. The *Blueprint* coalition was successful in increasing the number of participant subsidies for women from developing countries to attend the conference, creating a women's networking zone, organizing a march to raise awareness of women and girls and distributing information and materials concerning Canadian issues. The conference was attended by thousands of participants from around the world and hosted keynote speakers such as Stephen Lewis and President Bill Clinton.

CFSH hosted Regional Meetings for the International Planned Parenthood Federation in Canada. In August, CFSH welcomed 120 volunteers, Executive Directors and youth delegates from South America, Central America and the Caribbean for a series of meetings and training sessions regarding the important work we all do to promote sexual and reproductive health and rights. Fellow

Canadian Dr. Henry Morgentaler was awarded the IPPF/WHR Medal of Honor for Individual Contribution to Sexual and Reproductive Health. Dr. Morgentaler's moving acceptance speech reminded us all of the ongoing need to overcome barriers to access to safe, legal abortion services which exist in all countries, even Canada.

Nationally, CFSH made waves in the protection of youth sexual health rights. CFSH was selected as an expert witness and presented before the Standing Committee on Justice and Human Rights regarding Bill C-22. This proposed legislation attempted to amend the Criminal Code to change the Age of Consent and its provisions to the Age of Protection. In standing up for the best interests of youth, CFSH testified that accurate, non-judgmental sexual health information and choice is the best way to support and protect young people. The proposed legislation does not address the need for comprehensive sexual health education and services. Although the legislation has died on the order table, our commitment to youth protection and sexual health justice remains the same.

The success of this year was only possible through the ongoing support, dedication and expertise of our staff, Board, donors and members. We are excited about the impact of our work so far, and look forward to the year ahead.

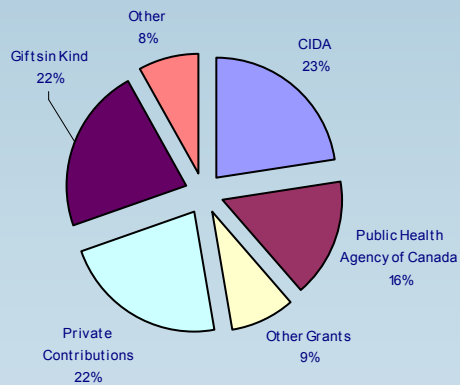
